Background and Objectives

- Western Oregon University (WOU) commissioned Stamats to evaluate the size and viability of five new programs at the master degree level.
- In a previous report, Stamats analyzed past degree completion data at the national and regional level to identify the 50 highest-scoring program fields for health-related programs, non-health programs, and programs that are disproportionately appealing to the Latinx student population.
- Among the top 50 programs presented to WOU, Stamats presented 10 master degree programs that showed high demand.
- WOU selected the following five for deeper investigation:
 - Master of Science Occupational Therapy
 - Master of Science Data Science/Analytics
 - Master of Science Social Work
 - Master of Science School Counseling
 - Master of Science Public Administration
- This report summarizes the demand and viability for each of the five in more detail.

Data Factors Used for Detailed Report

- The Stamats analysis on the five selected programs is based on the following data points:
 - Student demand IPEDS data shows past degree conferment data and provides a more reliable source of actions taken from students over the last 5 years. Data is analyzed at the national and regional level.
 - Employer demand Real-time job postings from the last 5 years are used to provide current labor demand for jobs related to each master degree program. The source for this data is Burning Glass Technologies' Labor Insight[™] software, which collects data from online job postings. Data is analyzed at the national and regional level.
 - Competitor profiles Based on the data provided in this report to date, we selected two competitors already operating in the degree program. The websites of each program were reviewed to provide WOU an overview of product, naming convention, cost, format, or other factors that contribute to the program's success.
 - Digital marketing Google Trends, Google Ad Words provide the data for this analysis. The digital marketing information informs WOU on the competition for the specific program and expected cost to raise WOU's rank in the search.

Student Demand – Degree Conferment Data



Data for a variety of factors/variables were compiled from the following sources and for the following purposes:

- Degree Conferment
 - Secondary data were compiled from the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS) provided by the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) to analyze:
 - Degrees conferred by program between 2013 and 2017 at the national level for all institutions
 - Degrees conferred by program between 2013 and 2017 regionally defined for this purpose as the states of Oregon and Washington
 - Degrees conferred by program between 2013 and 2017 by Latinx-serving institutions as identified by IPEDS
 - Mean and median cohort sizes for enrollment in all relevant programs

Student Demand Degree Conferment

Data Definitions



- **5-Year Change (Count):** The difference in the number of students enrolled between the most recent year and the first year included in analysis.
- 5-Year Change (%): Measures the rapidity of growth (or decline) in enrollment trends over time. The statistic is derived by dividing the number of students enrolled in 2017 by the number of students enrolled in 2013.
- Slope: Provides a ratio measure of the numbers of degrees awarded that increase (or decrease) each year.
- Mean: The average number of degrees awarded in a certain program between 2013 and 2017.
- Median: The mid-point value in a series of values.
- Slope/Mean: A statistic used to normalize the slope for each program to allow for meaningful comparisons. On its own, the slope value is limited in the amount of information it conveys about demand for a program because it is unique to the scale of the program. For instance, a slope value of 10 is consequential to a program with a mean conferment level of 100 degrees per year, but relatively meaningless for a large program with 100,000 degrees per year. The slope/mean statistic normalizes the slope value by dividing the slope by the mean number of degrees conferred within each program per year.

Student Demand – Degree Conferment

Comparable Institutions Definition

- In order to assess demand for potential new programs among enough comparable institutions, the following criteria were used to define a similar set of schools:
 - Public, non-profit and private, non-profit
 - Urbanization/Setting: Institutions in Metropolitan Statistical Areas (MSA) with 200,000-600,000 people. In addition, some of the schools that were included in the 2016 report that have fallen out of this category were added to this sample. The full sample is available separately in an Excel file.
 - Institutions must issue master's degrees.
 - Graduate enrollment at 25 percent or less.
 - Public flagships and land-grant public institutions were excluded.
 - Source: IPEDS dataset of degree completions over the past five years.
- This definition produces a total of 144 comparable institutions for this analysis.
- A full list of the comparable institutions is available in the supporting Excel file.

Employer Demand – Labor Market Data

Source Explanation



- Scale and trend of job postings for positions related to each program were compiled from Labor Insight, a labor market data aggregator hosted by Burning Glass Technologies.
- Labor Insight is a web scraping/spidering software tool that combs more than 40,000 job listing websites to gather millions of job postings annually. Content and text analysis of each listing provides up-to-date information regarding job titles, top skills, top employers, regional demand, education level, compensation, and many other parameters. Labor Insight supports customized reporting based on various criteria such as geographic area or date ranges/time periods for trending and comparative analysis.
- Job posting counts represent the fundamental unit for analysis. The universe of job listing
 pages and availability of listing content continues to change and expand. To ensure
 comprehensive capture of listings, Labor Insight continues to refine and optimize the
 technology and seeks to eliminate duplicate or redundant listings.

Employer Demand – Labor Market Data, Cont.

- The data-gathering process and analytical approach supports development of valuable insights regarding employment demand. However, job posting counts are not (and should not be) considered exact/precise measures of job openings or actual hiring activity. Additionally, relative comparisons and longitudinal analysis is generally accomplished using incidence measures or indexing to isolate real changes in activity versus changes created by the fluid nature of the online environment and, more importantly, refinements of the Labor Insight[™] tool.
- For the ensuing tables in each section, regional data are the combined states of Oregon and Washington.

Student Demand Degree Conferment CIP Codes

CIP Codes and Overview of Enrollment Trends

- The following slides summarize the associated Classification of Institutional Programs (CIP) codes, CIP program titles, and program abbreviations used in this analysis.
- CIP codes provide a taxonomic scheme that supports the accurate tracking and reporting of fields of study and program completions activity. The codes are created and maintained by the National Center for Education Statistics (NCES) and are the primary way programs are classified consistently across higher education institutions.
- Note that there is one main CIP code that captures most of the student demand for four of the five selected master degree programs.
- MS Data Science/Analytics is a new and developing interdisciplinary academic program. With new programs, there often are multiple codes under which existing programs/institutions report degree conferment. It takes many years before a CIP code is regularly used by many institutions. To capture student demand for this program, Stamats used five CIP codes that often portray this developing field of study. The CIP codes to define this are:
- 11.0802 Data Modeling/Warehousing and Database Administration
- 30.3001 Computational Science

- 26.1103 Bioinformatics
- 52.1301 Management Science
- 52.1302 Business Statistics

51.2306 Occupational Therapy/Therapist

A program that prepares individuals to assist patients limited by physical, cognitive, psychosocial, mental, developmental, and learning disabilities, as well as adverse environmental conditions, to maximize their independence and maintain optimum health through a planned mix of acquired skills, performance motivation, environmental adaptations, assistive technologies, and physical agents. Includes instruction in the basic medical sciences, psychology, sociology, patient assessment and evaluation, standardized and non-standardized tests and measurements, assistive and rehabilitative technologies, ergonomics, environmental health, special education, vocational counseling, health education and promotion, and professional standards and ethics.

44.0701 Social Work

A program that prepares individuals for the professional practice of social welfare administration and counseling, and that focus on the study of organized means of providing basic support services for vulnerable individuals and groups. Includes instruction in social welfare policy; case work planning; social counseling and intervention strategies; administrative procedures and regulations; and specific applications in areas such as child welfare and family services, probation, employment services, and disability counseling.

13.1101 Counselor Education/School Counseling and Guidance Services

A program that prepares individuals to apply the theory and principles of guidance and counseling to the provision of support for the personal, social, educational, and vocational development of students, and the organizing of guidance services within elementary, middle and secondary educational institutions. Includes instruction in legal and professional requirements, therapeutic counselor intervention, vocational counseling, and related sociological and psychological foundations.

44.0401 Public Administration

A program that prepares individuals to serve as managers in the executive arm of local, state, and federal government and that focuses on the systematic study of executive organization and management. Includes instruction in the roles, development, and principles of public administration; the management of public policy; executive-legislative relations; public budgetary processes and financial management; administrative law; public personnel management; professional ethics; and research methods.

Data Science/Analytics CIP Codes – five in total

11.0802 Data Modeling/Warehousing and Database Administration

A program that prepares individuals to design and manage the construction of databases and related software programs and applications, including the linking of individual data sets to create complex searchable databases (warehousing) and the use of analytical search tools (mining). Includes instruction in database theory, logic, and semantics; operational and warehouse modeling; dimensionality; attributes and hierarchies; data definition; technical architecture; access and security design; integration; formatting and extraction; data delivery; index design; implementation problems; planning and budgeting; and client and networking issues.

30.3001 Computational Science

A program that focuses on the study of scientific computing and its application. Includes instruction in scientific visualization, multi-scale analysis, grid generation, data analysis, applied mathematics, numerical algorithms, high performance parallel computing, and numerical modeling and simulation with applications in science, engineering, and other disciplines in which computation plays an integral role.



Data Science/Analytics CIP Codes, Cont.

52.1301 Management Science

• A general program that focuses on the application of statistical modeling, data warehousing, data mining, programming, forecasting, and operations research techniques to the analysis of problems of business organization and performance. Includes instruction in optimization theory and mathematical techniques, data mining, data warehousing, stochastic and dynamic modeling, operations analysis, and the design and testing of prototype systems and evaluation models.

52.1302 Business Statistics

A program that focuses on the application of mathematical statistics to the description, analysis, and forecasting of business data. Includes instruction in statistical theory and methods, computer applications, data analysis and display, long- and short-term forecasting methods, and market performance analysis.

Data Science/Analytics CIP Codes, Cont.

26.1103 Bioinformatics

A program that focuses on the application of computer-based technologies and services to biological, biomedical, and biotechnology research. Includes instruction in algorithms, network architecture, principles of software design, human interface design, usability studies, search strategies, database management and data mining, digital image processing, computer graphics and animation, CAD, computer programming, and applications to experimental design and analysis and to specific quantitative, modeling, and analytical studies in the various biological specializations.



Executive Summary

- All five programs have some strong reasons to develop new programs with the hope of increasing enrollment in graduate programs.
- The five programs also face competitive challenges from other colleges and universities requiring any new program to be well designed for student needs and marketed to sufficiently reach prospective students.
- Occupational therapy is a very strong program across the board and, from analysis of just the market forces, is the most likely to be introduced successfully. The overall demand is strong regionally, and the number of providers is limited as are the size of the cohorts the competitor programs admit.
- Challenges for introducing an occupational therapy program include:
 - The requirement that by 2027 all entry level OT professionals must have a doctorate.
 - The need for state legislative approval to offer a doctoral program.
 - Potential internal competition with a new physical therapy program at WOU.
 - Significant costs for introducing a new program including physical infrastructure (though this may be partially shared with a physical therapy program), attracting high quality faculty in a tight job market, and both monetary and administrative time pursuing accreditation.

Executive Summary

- Social work shows strong potential as a program and has strong regional growth both in the employment market and degree conferrals.
- The primary challenge with a new master's degree in social work is that Portland State offers the program both online and via distance education in Salem.
- Choosing to pursue social work and devoting adequate resources to the introduction of the program would likely lead to a successful program, but there is significant local competition with Portland State's program.
- Social work will require accreditation to be considered a high-quality program.
- **School counseling** is likely to have a higher degree of risk given the shaky K-12 degree demand across all disciplines. School counseling is highly susceptible to market fluctuations which are in turn impacted by state legislative decisions.
- Job listings and general employment demand is strong for school counseling, and the requirement for a teaching license in the State of Oregon provides Oregon-based universities a built-in market for students.
- A strongly marketed school counseling program could produce a reasonably sized program while also being somewhat insulated from competitor institutions.



Executive Summary

- Public administration has faced mixed degree demand, but job prospects are reasonably strong. Overall, the potential for this program is mixed.
- WOU's primary competitors are the University of Oregon and Portland State University which both focus on full-time students who can attend an on-campus program.
- Evergreen State College in Olympia, Washington offers a model for how a program near the state capital can be relatively successful by focusing on professionals seeking to enhance their career prospects by attending part-time at night. Nighttime classes, classes on weekends, or online courses would offer WOU a strong competitive advantage in the State of Oregon and locally.
- Data science offers some of the strongest growth in both employment and degrees granted and may well be a great choice for WOU.
- Having strong growth and job demand still requires a strong understanding of whether WOU can provide a competitive advantage locally given Oregon State's online program which just entered the market. Another challenge other institutions have faced in this discipline is hiring and retaining qualified faculty. If core faculty can be recruited from current faculty WOU would be in a far stronger position.
- Potential ways to enhance the program would be to offer concentrations or specializations in health care informatics which local health care employers may find especially attractive.

- The American Occupational Therapy Association (AOTA) is requiring that all programs preparing students for entry level employment as occupational therapists must move to the doctoral level by 2027.
- Most programs are still offering master's degrees but are transitioning to doctoral programs between now and 2027.

 Doctoral degrees are increasing notably over time. Regionally there are relatively few institutions offering doctorates currently with only Pacific University and the University of Puget Sound recording conferrals in 2017.

Occupational Therapy – Regional Institutions

While there are only two regional institutions issuing doctoral degrees as of 2017, there are only four institutions issues master's degrees in occupational therapy in Oregon and Washington as of 2017.

- Master's degrees in the region decreased by 26 conferrals but doctorates increased by 34, suggesting the transition to doctoral programs is already occurring regionally.
- Even with the transition to doctoral degrees as the entry degree to the profession, nationally, Latinx serving institutions, and comparable institutions have demonstrated strong growth in degrees granted over the last five years.
- Doctoral degrees do have lower median and mean cohorts over the five-year period analyzed. The means and median cohorts are likely to increase as the transition to doctoral degrees continues.

- The Northwest is producing far fewer occupational therapy career entrants than other regions relative to population and the strong demand for occupational therapists.
- Assuming Western Oregon gains approval to offer professional doctoral degrees from the state legislature, a doctoral program in occupational therapy would likely be a very strong addition given the conferral trends both nationally, regionally, and in comparable institutions.
- While cohort sizes vary from different types of institutions, a large public institution in an urban area indicates that one might expect up to 30 incoming students per year. These projections are based on 3-5 years of a successful marketing campaign, sufficient institutional resources (spaces, labs, faculty, etc.) to support this specific program, and accreditation achievement.
- As both physical therapy and occupational therapy would be introduced at relatively similar times, a strong marketing plan to make both successful is essential. The programs have the potential to compete for students as they will both be at the doctoral level.
- Much of the competition for students regionally are the same for both physical and occupational therapy.

Occupational Therapy – Labor Market Data

At both the doctoral and master's degree level the number of job postings has increased over the last five years nationally, regionally, and in the Salem MSA. Most important is the Salem MSA has no institutions offering master's or doctoral degrees.

- The strength of the profession across geographies indicates that growth should continue for the foreseeable future.
- While the transition to requiring a doctorate degree for entry into the field will not happen fully until 2027, the job postings requiring the OTD is already increasing significantly now at very high rates.
- The next few slides identify the top employers for both degree levels, skills identified in job postings, and then the overall salary for different degree levels. These data are designed to identify skills and competencies academic programs will want to include to meet student and market demand. This includes specialized skills, general skills, and software skills.

Occupational Therapy Skills – Labor Market Data

The table identifies and describes the top 15 specialized skills listed in job postings.

Top 15 Specialized Skills	Skills Description
Occupational Therapy	Occupational therapy (OT) is the use of assessment and intervention to develop, recover, or maintain the meaningful activities, or occupations, of individuals, groups, or communities.
Treatment Planning	A detailed plan with information about a patient's disease, the goal of treatment, the treatment options for the disease and possible side effects, and the expected length of treatment.
Rehabilitation	
Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR)	Cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) is an emergency procedure that combines chest compressions often with artificial ventilation in an effort to manually preserve intact brain function until further measures are taken to restore spontaneous blood circulation and breathing in a person who is in cardiac arrest.
Patient Care	The services rendered by members of the health profession and non-professionals under their supervision for the benefit of the patient.
Therapy	Therapy (often abbreviated TX) is the attempted remediation of a health problem, usually following a diagnosis.

Adaptive Equipment	Adaptive equipment are devices that are used to assist with completing activities of daily living.

The table identifies and describes the top 15 general skills listed in job postings.

Top 15 General Skills	Skills Description
Communication Skills	The ability to convey information to another effectively and efficiently.
Physical Abilities	Physical Abilities, which refers to the ability to quickly and repeatedly bend, stretch, twist, or reach out with the body, arms, and/or legs. These abilities often require strength, endurance, flexibility, balance and coordination.
Teamwork / Collaboration	Collaboration and teamwork requires a mix of interpersonal, problem solving, and communication skills and are needed for a group to work together towards a common goal.
Written Communication	Working experience of Written Communication, which involves any type of message that makes use of the written word. Written communication is the most important and the most effective of any mode of business communication.
Fine Motor Skills	Fine motor skill (or dexterity) is the coordination of small muscles, in movements usually involving the synchronization of hands and fingers with the eyes.
Planning	Planning (also called forethought) is the process of thinking about and organizing the activities required to achieve a desired goal.





- For competitor review, Stamats selected the following three programs for marketing review at the doctorate level. As graduate Occupational Therapy programs are transitioning to the doctoral level, it's more important to understand how other regional competitors are making this switch. All are showing strong conferral data.
 - Pacific University has transitioned to the doctor of occupational therapy for entry level students.
 - University of Puget Sound is transitioning quickly from master's to doctoral program now.
 - Eastern Washington University is in an earlier state of change from the master's to doctoral degree.

- Overall, Occupational Therapy shows strong growth in degrees and employment across the nation and only one program currently exists in Oregon. Western Oregon would be well suited to offer another program in Oregon. However, the initial investment in facilities, faculty, and meeting accreditation standards for the program will be considerable.

Pacific University

- Pacific University is the first and only professional occupational therapy school in Oregon.
- Over the last few years the university has transitioned to all entrylevel students pursing a doctorate instead of a master's degree.
- The program takes three years with the first two years on campus with a third year delivered remotely.



The School of Occupational Therapy offers an entry-level Occupational Therapy Doctorate (OTD) program for applicants who have completed a bachelor's degree and prerequisites.

Enrollment is limited to 40 students with courses taking place over 36 months. Summers are included in the program.

Pacific University

- Website content focuses on the OT career and job prospects for graduates.

This is an entry-level master's degree program taught by faculty who are nationally recognized in the occupational therapy profession. Our mission is to prepare entry-level graduates to provide occupational therapy services with distinctiveness and compassion, in a variety of professional practice environments.

The program provides a foundation of skills in general practice competencies,

- The program website, compared to University of Puget Sound, offers less information and is less appealing to a prospective student. The message focuses mostly on the selectivity of the program and the basics of how to apply.
- The program enrolls 32 students per year.
- Tuition per year for residents of Washington is \$13,670 and \$29,169 for non-residents.
- The fieldwork program requires:
 - Fieldwork Level I is embedded within three semesters of coursework in mental health, pediatrics, and adult physical disabilities.
 - Fieldwork Level II provides the learner with the opportunity to apply and integrate didactic knowledge, skills, and behaviors to occupational therapy practice in traditional and emerging settings. Students will complete a minimum of 24 weeks of Fieldwork in the summer and fall semesters following the completion of all didactic coursework.
- The program offers a shortened program for those already attending Eastern Washington at the undergraduate level.

- Nationally and regionally, master's degrees in social work or the Master of Social Work (MSW) are showing steady growth in degrees conferred over the last five years.
- Institutions serving Latinx students and comparable institutions have shown even stronger growth with 35 and 39 percent increases in the degrees granted over the five-year period.
- Growth is especially strong in institutions serving similar students to the students served by Western Oregon suggesting it would be a strong program for Western Oregon.
- Cohorts of graduates are very large with a typical MSW program awarding 64 degrees in 2017.

- Regionally, there are five established institutions conferring master's degrees in social work over the last five years with Portland State being the largest competitor in Oregon.
- Cohort sizes are very robust in both universities in large cities and those in eastern Washington suggesting strong overall demand.
- While cohort sizes vary from different types of institutions, data indicate that WOU might expect up to 50 incoming students per year. These projections are based on 3-5 years of a successful marketing campaign, sufficient institutional resources (spaces, labs, faculty, etc.,) to support this specific program, and accreditation achievement.



Social Work

- For competitor review, Stamats selected the following three programs;
 - Portland State University is the largest competitor in Oregon, it will be critical to understand their approach.
 - University of Washington Tacoma –is offered in a part-time, evening 3-year MSW, which combines classroom learning with faculty-guided fieldwork and is touted as a great option for working professionals. Operating under the auspices of the main campus in Seattle, this may provide a model for Western Oregon as well.
 - Washburn University, a public school in Topeka, KS is a comparable institution in terms of location and size.
- All three programs offer advanced standing programs for those who have a Bachelor of Social Work or a similar degree and students can reduce the number of credits they must take in the graduate program.
- All three programs have accreditation from the Council of Social Work Education (CSWE) which is true of most higher-quality programs.
- Overall social work programs show strong conferral data regionally and nationally, and there is strong job demand for those with a master's degree in social work. The two primary challenges are achieving accreditation from CSWE and that Portland State will be a local competitor not just a regional competitor.

- Portland State University is the largest program in the region with an average of 210 Master of Social Work graduates each year.
- It's the only public university program in Oregon accredited by the Council on Social Work Education (CSWE).
- The program is offered in Portland, Eugene, Salem, Central Oregon, Southern Oregon, or online – this is a tough competitor to any program WOU might consider.
- Distance education sites are offered for the locations outside of Portland.
- The program requires 78 credits.



- Portland State's program would be in direct competition with WOU given that the program not only offers an online program, but also a distance option in Salem. For this reason, Stamats has included the full online and distance options for WOU to understand the potential competition from Portland State.
- The program is targeted towards both full-time and part-time students while still utilizing a cohort model for students taking different numbers of courses at a given time. Portland State is partially able to do this because it is such a large program.
- Tuition runs \$499 per credit up to 12 hours for residents and \$726 per credit up to 12 hours for non-residents and \$500 per term in fees. Differential rates do apply for distance education sites.
- The website is focused on providing information about the program and potential careers for students. Information sessions are identified as the primary method for prospective students to engage with the Portland State site, distant sites, and the online program option. Information sessions are identified as part of a call to action.
- Admission requirements include:
 - Resume including Social Work-related experience, three Letters of Reference, a three to four-page statement of purpose, calculated upper level GPA for undergraduate work, and transcripts demonstrating a bachelor's degree.

- Portland State's program offers four advanced concentrations requiring three course sequences.
 - Practice and Leadership with Communities and Organizations
 - Health Across the Lifespan
 - Social Work with Children, Youth and Families
 - Clinical Social Work Practice
- The program has three different options clearly identified for new students. Options depend on student's ability to devote time to the program and outline two, three, and four-year course schedules.
- The online options allows for:
 - Complete the MSW Online Option in 3 years following a prescribed curriculum and cohort model.
 - Study either the Practice and Leadership with Communities and Organizations concentration or the Health Across the Lifespan concentration.
 - Classes completely online, including periodic face-to-face meetings with faculty using technology.
 - On campus orientation in Portland 2 days of community building and instruction before each academic year.
 - Complete your field placement in or near your community of residence.

- The distance options allows for:

- Master's degrees in school counseling have been showing a downward trend over the last five years nationally, regionally, and at comparable institutions.
- Latinx serving institutions have had 7.3 percent increase in degrees conferred.
- Despite the downward trend, the size of the mean and median cohorts are healthy at a median of 20 and mean of 28 over the last five years.

While overall mean and median cohorts are relatively strong, the regional institutions show a distinct difference in cohort size between the larger institutions and smaller institutions. Larger institutions mean degree conferral rate over the five years can be 30-55 students and smaller programs may be as small as 5-6 students.


- While cohort sizes vary from different types of institutions, data indicate that WOU might expect up to 20 incoming students per year. These projections are based on 3-5 years of a successful marketing campaign, sufficient institutional resources (spaces, labs, faculty, etc.) to support this specific program, and accreditation achievement.
- Underfunding K-12 education has created a scarcity for teachers which also negatively impacts the need for school counselors. The state legislature's decisions on funding K-12 education increases the risk for introducing this program.
- Usually strong employment market demand creates an increase in conferrals, but with K-12 education fields this is also highly dependent on state laws and regulations.



School Counseling

- All three programs are accredited by the Council for Accreditation of Counseling and Related Education Programs (CACREP).
- Accreditation standards for CACREP are available here: https://www.cacrep.org/for-programs/2016-cacrep-standards/
- For competitor review, Stamats selected the following three programs;
 - Portland State University is the largest competitor in Oregon and has had a steady cohort size over the last five years.
 - Oregon State University is the second largest competitor in the state and has shown modest growth during a period of general decline.
 - Indiana University South Bend is similar to Western Oregon University as a state school with a similar campus setting in terms of geography and population. Indiana University started as a smaller program and has grown modestly over the last five years.

- Portland State offers a master's program in school counseling with two potential tracks:
 - Those with two or more years of teaching in accredited public schools.
 - Those without teaching experience.
- Both tracks require 90 total credits, taking three years including two summers.
- Portland State has had a steady rate of conferrals over the last five years with 48 conferrals in 2013 and 47 in 2017.

Track I and Track II requirements

Track I is for individuals who can document two or more years of successful teaching experience in Oregon schools or in out-of-state public or accredited private schools. Track I students complete 90 credits that include 6 credits of electives to be arranged with your advisor. (For more information on teaching experience requirement, please contact TSPC directly and/or consult TSPC OAR 584-044-0011.)

Track II is designed for individuals who cannot document two years of prior teaching experience. TSPC requires students to complete the entire program before being eligible for an initial license. Track II students complete 90 credits that include a 6 credit, 200 clock-hour teaching practicum as part of their program.

The program of study leading to a MA or MS in Education: Counseling includes the following 84 credits plus 6 credits of electives for Track I, or 6 credits of teaching practicum for Track II to reach 90 credits.


- The program is designed to fit Oregon standards for school counseling and the specific requirements for licensure in the state.

- Indiana University –South Bend offers a Master of Science in Education/School Counseling.
- The program requires 60 credits over three years.
- The program is smaller than the previous two profiled programs with 13 degrees granted in 2013 and 15 in 2017.
- While the website fails to mention it, the program is CACREP accredited.
- Marketing is very limited as with many programs in K-12 education often focused more on attracting students through professional networks.
- Cohorts include 24 students each fall.

Master of Science in Education/School Counseling

The Master of Science in Education/School Counseling consists of 60 credit hours of graduate study. This program leads to licensure as a professional school counselor in the state of Indiana and prepares candidates to work in the school setting with P-12 students, parents, administrators, and other stakeholders. Students fulfill requirements in both the common counseling core of the curriculum as well as courses specific to school counseling. The program follows a cohort model wherein students are admitted and take courses with an identified group of their peers. The program can be completed in a minimum of three years of full-time study, which includes summer classes.

- Declines in degrees granted are observed nationally, in capital city public administration programs, and in comparable institutions.
- Regionally, public administration degrees granted are relatively flat.
- Latinx-serving institutions have seen a significant increase in master's in public administration degrees granted.
- Median and mean cohorts of graduating students are relatively high, but there is large distance between the mean and median suggesting large programs have a disproportionate share of the market.

Public administration master's programs in capital cities are declining on average but are also not terribly large in terms of cohort size. Seven of the 12 programs above had a mean cohort of 26 or fewer students over the 5-year period reviewed.

Programs with larger cohort sizes include University of Illinois – Springfield, Drake, Evergreen State, and Indiana University–Purdue University–Indianapolis (IUPUI). IUPUI was debatable for inclusion given the criteria stated previously.

- Nearly half of master's degrees in public administration regionally are granted by the University of Washington – Seattle Campus.
- Portland State and the University of Oregon both offer the program and Portland State has strong cohort sizes though they are declining.
- While there appears to be potential demand in Oregon, two strong programs are based both north and south of Western Oregon with University of Oregon and Portland State.
- Public administration has some potential for Western Oregon but carries considerable risk as a new program in light of degree trends and present competition.

- Public administration job postings are showing strong growth both nationally and regionally.
- Public administration job postings are decreasing in the Salem MSA. This may seem counterintuitive given Salem is the state capital, but one thing to keep in mind is that while many state government jobs may require or prefer master's degrees, those jobs are often open to different degree fields.

- While cohort sizes vary from different types of institutions, data indicate that WOU might expect up to 25 incoming students per year. These projections are based on 3-5 years of a successful marketing campaign, sufficient institutional resources (spaces, labs, faculty, etc.) to support this specific program, and accreditation achievement.
- For competitor review, Stamats selected the following three programs;
 - Portland State University is largest competitor in Oregon and understanding their approach will be critical to creating a competitive program.
 - University of Oregon-second largest competitor in Oregon, also important to understand how to stand out from a key player if you enter this market.
 - Evergreen State College in Olympia, WA strong enrollment, offers the program in 2 years with evening and weekend courses, can be done part-time, in person which is likely to fit the needs of many state and interest group employees.
- Compared to Portland State and the University of Oregon there would be competitive space to serve current practitioners looking to advance their careers. The Portland State and University of Oregon programs are more focused on research and full-time students.



- Portland State University offers the Master of Public Administration with five potential specializations.
- The department also offers Master's degrees in Master of Public Administration: Health Administration, Master of Nonprofit Leadership, and Master of Public Policy as well as an Executive Master of Public Administration.
- The program has conferred 59 degrees in 2013 which declined to 54 degrees in 2017. The program peaked with 74 degrees in 2014.



- The national market for master's degrees in data analytics is strong across all five CIP codes analyzed. Bioinformatics, a very specialized CIP code, has experienced the smallest increase. Often institutions report health-related data science/analytics programs under other CIP codes.
- The trend nationally is very strong, and all evidence indicates that trend is expected to continue over the next few years at least. Even when the degree growth slows, the cohort size for programs looks to be strong.

- Regionally there have been a relatively small number of programs that started over the last five years. Oregon Health & Science University is the only institution to have offered a program for the entire 5-year period. Thus, it's difficult to project a cohort size for a new program.
- Growth is strong overall in the region. However, only the University of Washington Seattle Campus and Oregon Health & Science University have significant cohort sizes.
- Given the dearth of regional programs, a general program is likely to be successful and could reasonably expect 20 – 30 degrees awarded per year.

- Growth is strong across all four types of institutions analyzed including nationally, regionally, Latinx-serving institutions, and comparable institutions.
- The slowest growth is at comparable institutions; note by definition comparable institutions are not based in large urban centers where growth in a new discipline will often occur.
- Latinx-serving institutions have shown the largest increase in the number of Master's degrees granted over the five-year period.
- It is important to note that two institutions account for the increase in degrees granted by Latinxserving institutions: the University of Illinois – Chicago and San Diego State University.
- While master's degrees in data science/analytics are likely to experience more competitors, the current market suggests that investing in such a program has a strong chance at succeeding based on student demand and lack of regional competition. However, a sound marketing strategy is necessary as part of WOU's challenge with this program will be clarifying to prospective students what this program prepares them to do.

- Data represents real-time job postings from the Labor Insight tool.



- While cohort sizes vary from different types of institutions, data indicate that WOU might expect up to 25-30 incoming students per year. These projections are based on 3-5 years of a successful marketing campaign, sufficient institutional resources (spaces, labs, faculty, etc.) to support this specific program, and accreditation achievement.
- Data science is performing very strongly for most institutions and is showing growth everywhere in the country. While that growth is widespread, land grant and large public research institutions have done better with the program likely because they have the faculty available to teach the programs already. Smaller universities have a more mixed record of success, but many show strong growth when they can create a high-quality program including finding faculty who they can retain.

Data Science/Analytics

- Oregon State's entry with a completely online program does increase the competition for students that WOU will want to attract. Focusing on the ability to take in person classes is likely a critical comparative advantage should WOU pursue a data analytics program.
- For competitor review, Stamats selected the following three programs:
 - University of Washington Seattle is also a new program but has a large first cohorts of graduates and is in the same region.
 - Oregon State University is a new entrant, offers an online program, and is likely a chief competitor to WOU.
 - Oregon Health & Science which has one of the more mature regional programs and it is more focused on bioinformatics.



University of Washington

- The University of Washington offers a Master of Science in Data Science that is offered face-to-face oncampus only.
- The program has only graduated one cohort of 35 students in 2017.
- The program may be taken full or part-time over an average of 1.5 to 2.5 years.
- Classes are offered in the evening on the University of Washington campus in Seattle.











Digital Marketing – Location of People Searching





Digital Marketing – Location of People Searching





- Western Oregon must determine how to effectively and efficiently allocate resources to marketing and recruitment efforts for the program.
- Over the past decade, digital marketing has become one of the best ways to communicate and interact with prospective students (graduate students included), who choose computers and phones over paper every day.
- It's clear that the journey is a mobile one, so when launching a new program, ensure you have the website landing pages synching with keywords of importance (i.e. MPA, MSW, Business Intelligence as examples) and that the navigation and content supports a mobile journey. To raise your visibility, you will need to invest in a digital marketing strategy and this data gives you some insight as to what that would cost today.
- Tapping into the talents of a digital strategist, either with an external partner or utilizing existing University, College, or departmental personnel, will help to ensure this program garners the desired interest and enrollment levels.

Digital Marketing – Success Factors

A highly focused strategy is critical

Optimized Landing Page

- Use targeted keywords in your ads
- Match ad creative to the landing page
- Provide a clean and clear journey; make sure it's mobile friendly
- Focus on driving conversions
- Multiple landing pages may be necessary for each ad group

Negative Keywords

- Add negative keywords to the campaign strategy
- Prevents ads from being triggered by irrelevant words or phrases
- Limits budget wasted on low quality searches
- Keep ads from showing next to phrases that can damage your brand image

Close Monitoring

- Broaden or narrow keywords based on results on almost a daily basis
- Budget and bid adjustments frequently given the high cost of ads
- Use A/B tests to optimize ads
